

**Steel Beam Children's Theatre Opens its 11<sup>th</sup> Season with *The Tale of Snow White*,  
an Old Favorite with a Fractured Fairytale Twist, September 10 - October 2, 2011**

Steel Beam Children's Theatre's *The Tale of Snow White* takes a twisted turn when a contemporary mom and her two children present *their* version of the traditional tale. While the struggle between the kind and good Snow White (Mara Handler, STC) and the evil Queen (Allison Griffiths, STC) remains, beloved characters are tweaked, and wild, wacky new characters appear when the siblings use their imaginations to create a fresh new version that captures the fable's timeless message - home is where the heart is and love conquers all.

*The Tale of Snow White* opens Steel Beam Children's Theatre's 11th season and runs Saturday, September 10-Sunday, October 2. Show times are Saturdays at 10:30 am and 1:00 pm and Sundays at 1:00pm. Mr. Kelly is a company member of The New Colony and an artistic associate at Porchlight Music Theatre. He graduated from the University of Illinois at Chicago in 2008 with degrees in Acting and Vocal Performance.

The Steel Beam Children's Theatre's motto is *It's What Happens Off-Stage that Counts* to emphasize Steel Beam's belief that participation in theatre is not simply about winning a starring role, and that life skills like communication, discipline, teamwork and respect are developed during the rehearsal and performance process.
